Baggie Rabbit

To Make: Copy the head, arms and legs of the rabbit. You can have the children color them or you can make a stencil and have the children trace and cut the needed pieces of construction paper. Turn a small ziplock bag on it's side and attach the head, arms and legs to the baggie using glue. Print color and cut the carrots. Use with the attached rhyme.

I also attached a body piece in case you just want to use this as a cut and paste activity. Tune: Up on the Rooftop
Out in the garden there I see
(10) little carrots growing
merrily,
Peter came and ate one
oops, Oh, No.
Now there's only (9) carrots in
the row.

To use: Have the kids sing the above rhyme as they add carrots to Peter's tummy (the ziplock bag)
